## From the Marshal's Desk

**Burning Restrictions:** Even with the dry conditions, at this time, outdoor cooking and recreational fires are still allowed in the Village. Recreational campfires and outdoor fireplaces are allowed as long as the fires consist of natural wood or manufactured fire log material. Recreational fires must be fully contained within an approved permanent fire pit, portable fireplace device or outdoor fireplace. The burning of trash, brush, leaves and lawn/garden debris is prohibited. If you choose to have a recreational fire, please use extra care to insure the fire does not escape from your intended area

**Fireworks Restrictions:** Fireworks use is regulated within the village limits. Any fireworks that explode or shoot into the air are generally prohibited without a permit. Please be careful when using allowed fireworks so that unintended fires do not result due to the dry conditions. Fireworks regulations will be strictly enforced.

**Summer Social Events:** When hosting or attending summertime social events, please drink alcoholic beverages responsibly. Summer heat may increase the desire to consume too many alcoholic beverages. If possible, use a designated driver if you plan to drink alcoholic beverages and travel home afterward. If you have any questions regarding the above items or anything else law enforcement related, please contact me.

### 2024 Elections—Feb. 20th, Apr. 2nd, Aug. 13th, & Nov. 5th



The [MyVote.wi.gov](http://MyVote.wi.gov) website allows you to request an absentee ballot and the information is sent directly to the clerk. You will need to provide photo ID if you have not already provided it, and be registered (you can also register to vote on the website (now 28 day residency required), check your registration, see if you have voter ID on file, or check if you have already requested a ballot for the calendar year elections). The website allows you to track your ballot once an absentee request has been made through it (but please plan ahead as mailed absentee's now need to go through the postal system). You can make a copy of your ID and submit it with an absentee application through the clerk's office door slot. The clerk's office will be open for in-person absentee voting. Please watch for postings on dates and time to do so.
