## ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2025

In response to the dynamic challenges of modern society, the Brownsville Police Department has continued to prioritize the importance of building a strong relationship and partnership with the community it serves. The Brownsville Police Department has actively participated in various community events throughout the year. The department emphasized high visibility while on duty, allowing an officer to be more approachable and available to the community. By participating in community events, maintaining visible presence, and working collaboratively with residents, the department has not only ensured the safety of the Village but also enhanced the quality of life for its residents, businesses, and visitors alike.

The Brownsville Police Department participated in events held at the public library. The Brownsville Police Department made appearances at soccer and baseball games held at Dale Michels Park. The department took part in the annual Turkey Trot, a community event that promotes health and wellness.

The Brownsville Police Department has actively engaged in joint operations with other law enforcement and emergency response agencies in Dodge County. This collaborative approach enhanced the efficiency and effectiveness of public safety services. These additional resources allowed for improved response times and support during times of emergencies, ensuring the residents had received the assistance they deserved. The Brownsville Police Department provided mutual aid to the Dodge County Sheriff's Department and the Brownsville Fire Company First Responders.

Since 2016, the Brownsville Police Department has actively participated in the Standard Mutual Aid Response Team (SMART) agreement. This collaborative initiative encompasses police agencies within Dodge County, aimed at enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of law enforcement responses during emergencies. The primary objective of the SMART agreement is to ensure that law enforcement agencies are equipped with the necessary personnel and resources in times of crisis. This collaboration allows for a more unified response to incidents that may threaten or result in the loss of life or property. The SMART team can be activated in various scenarios, particularly those that surpass the existing physical and organizational capabilities of a single law enforcement agency. Such situations may include natural disasters, large-scale emergencies, or incidents involving hazardous materials that require a coordinated response.

Since 2024, the Brownsville Police Department has enhanced its operational capabilities by having a member join the Dodge County Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT Team. This collaboration is part of a strategic effort to improve response effectiveness for low-frequency and high-risk calls for service. The Dodge County Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT Team is known for its commitment to maintaining higher standards of training. The Brownsville Police Department's participation in the Dodge County Multi-Jurisdictional SWAT Team represents a significant investment in the safety and preparedness. By leveraging advanced training and resources, the department is better equipped to manage high-risk situations, ultimately enhancing public safety within the community.

The administrative responsibilities performed throughout the year supported the overall objectives throughout the year. Regular reports were generated to track incidents. Fulfillment of open record requests were processed in a timely manner, ensuring transparency and accessibility. New policies and procedures were researched, developed, and adopted. Participation in meetings facilitated communication and collaboration. Monthly documentation was submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Justice, ensuring ongoing compliance with state requirements. Data was collected and reported under WIBRS to provide detailed information on incidents, enhancing the understanding of crime trends and public safety. Comprehensive reports regarding the Use of Force incidents were submitted, in compliance with state regulations. Records of all trainings throughout the year were maintained and submitted through the ACADIS system.

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The data below is an approximate breakdown of the hours and cases generated by the Brownsville Police Department throughout 2025. The data demonstrates a notable increase in traffic stops compared to the previous year. In 2024, the Brownsville Police Department conducted a total of 303 traffic stops. In 2025, the Brownsville Police Department conducted a total of 461 traffic stops. This rise suggests a heightened focus on enforcing traffic laws and ensuring public safety on the roads. This uptick indicates a growing demand for police services and highlights the ongoing challenges within the community. Some of the traffic stops led to additional discoveries, including locating firearms, illegal narcotics and drivers that were operating a vehicle without a valid license. The data for 2025 indicates a proactive approach by the Brownsville Police Department in addressing public safety through increased traffic enforcement and responding to community needs.
