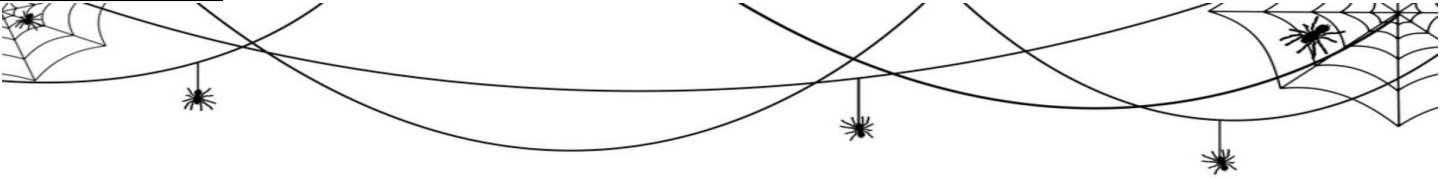

A reminder that burning of leaves is prohibited in the Village. Leaves may be taken to the Village compost pile behind the back ball diamond, southwest in the park, or raked to the curb for a scheduled fall leaf vacuum pick-up.
