

WI State Statutes 174.07 requires a dog license for the keeping of a dog over 5 months of age. Village Dog Licenses are valid for the calendar year (Jan. 1 to Dec. 31) and must be obtained annually. Dog licenses are obtained from the Village Clerk's office.

Fees are <u>\$3.00 (for neutered/spayed)</u> and <u>\$8.00 (for un-neutered/un-spayed)</u> if obtained by March 31st, 2024. Dog owners obtaining licenses on or after April 1, 2024 for dogs that were 5 months or older before that date will be subject to a \$5.00 per dog late fee.

State law also REQUIRES current proof of rabies vaccination. Valid proof of rabies vaccination certificates include the veterinarian's name, rabies vac. Manufacturer, serial number, date the vaccination was given and the date the vaccination expires.

Failure to obtain a annual dog license for your dog may result in you being subject to a \$500 fine and/or a 60 day jail sentence. If you are no longer the owner of a dog previously licensed in the Village of Brownsville, please let the clerk know.
